


Building on a century-long tradition of developing and preparing our local youth to be future leaders.

Keith Hubbard was a long-time supporter of Scouting in Northwest Ohio. He served as the Council President of the then Shawnee Council from 1977-1979. He was awarded the prestigious Silver Beaver Award by the council in 1978 and the North Star Award in 2012. Keith passed away February 24, 2012.

Keith was the Founder, President and CEO of The Hubbard Company, a printing and office supply company in Defiance, Ohio since 1951. He attended The Ohio State University and graduated from The Defiance College. Keith proudly served in the United States Army from 1952-1955 during the Korean Conflict attaining the rank of artillery captain. He continued to serve in the Army Reserves until 1964.

He served on the Board of Trustees at Defiance College and the Ohio Foundation of Independent Colleges. He was a member of the Defiance Rotary Club, the Defiance Area Foundation, the Defiance Chamber of Commerce, The Ohio State Alumni Association, Ducks Unlimited, VFW, York Rite and Scottish Rite (32nd Degree) Masons, Zenobia Shriners, Defiance County Fish and Game, American Legion, AMVETS, Elks, Eagles, and Friends of the Library.

Keith was the recipient of the Defiance Area Chamber of Commerce Leadership Award in 1991; the Distinguished Silver Pilgrim Medal, Defiance College's highest honor, in 1998; and the Ohio Foundation of Independent Colleges Volunteer Lifetime Achievement Award in 2005.

CAMPING – SCOUTING’S OUTDOOR LABORATORY

Three-fourths of the word Scouting is “outing”. For generations Scouting has provided more than a chance to experience the glories of nature. It has and continues to be the doorway to a lifelong journey of personal discovery and service, helping build boys and young men into leaders for life.

Camp Lakota serves as a premier outdoor youth development and leadership destination for over **1,000 youth** each summer. During the fall, winter and spring weekends, the camp is full of Scouts, youth from the community and their families that are participating in both unit events and area wide events.

The Black Swamp Area Council has identified the need for new larger dining hall in the center of camp at Lakota. Improving camp is critical to keeping Scouting programs appealing to young people, keeping them in Scouting longer, and increasing the benefits they receive from the Boy Scouts’ proven program.

The existing Meecheway Lodge has served Camp Lakota well as the main dining and gathering facility since 1948, however the expansion of the camp geography, increase in camp participation and community involvement make the new dining hall a critical enhancement to Camp Lakota.
